TREASURERS REPORT

FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2017

I have pleasure in sumitting the 62nd Annual Report for the Club. There was a net decrease in available funds of \$30,446, but after amortization of the synthetic green (\$10,000) our unallocated funds had a net decrease of \$40,446. This has resulted from an decrease in income of \$1,862 and an increase in expenditure of \$23,040 compared with the previous period. There have been many factors influencing the result, some of which are:-

- 1. we must remember when looking at income that we are comparing a trading period for 2017 of 12 months with a trading period for 2016 of 15 months.
- 2. if we were to compare 12 months this year with 12 months last year we would see an increase in income of approx \$25,000.
- 3. the continued influx of new members from the Omega Cricket Club thru the night pennant competition and others via the bare foot bowls program.
- 4. the continued support of social membership from the Italian Social Club along with their willingness to contribute towards such expenses during the year as the internal painting of the clubhouse and the installation of our new audio equipment.
- 5. the increase in expenditure can be put down to the internal painting of the clubhouse, along with \$11,637 on equipment purchases such as the audio system, a new TV etc. Our share of the cost of the new bar amounted to \$36,943. This cost was forced upon us as a result of the old bar floor rotting out & the Council's decision to gut the place & start again.
 - 6. interest income totalled \$2,735 all of which was rolled over & re-invested.

The asset register I am informed has been kept more for insurance purposes than for accounting purposes, so please don't simply accept the values attributed to each asset, they might be slightly overstated.
