Surprisingly our total membership is up by only 4 from last year. This is obviously a reflection of Covid and members not renewing. ### **Facilities Report**

#### Jan Shaw Green

For those who have recently joined and those Members who may have forgotten, this is what the Jan Shaw Green used to look like, a lot has changed on the South side of our venue!





It was a huge project, and we appreciate the support of the Victorian State Government and Kingston City Council. With our growing membership we needed more greens space and entertainment space for our popular barefoot bowls and functions. The necessary lifting of the green up by almost one meter caused additional complications such as ramps for disability access and Greenskeeper equipment and of course the new deck and BBQ area. This area is now a showcase for lawn bowls and will be put to great use by members and our local community.

#### Maintenance

Thank you once again to all the volunteers who give their time during our working bees to keep the club rooms and gardens in great shape. Thanks especially to those members who always step forward to lend a hand, Haydn Andrews as always with his able assistant Colin Litton and Paul Mathewson for helping with the bins. We have 28 bins now, the maximum allowed, so dragging them out and in is no small task. Thanks to members who have given their time weekly to keep the gardens looking beautiful.

Along with the establishment of the Jan Shaw Green and Deck, we had great support from Kingston City Council in supporting works such as replacing all the South side windows and brickwork. KCC also addressed ALL our requested upgrade and maintenance issues, such as the new carpet and painting. We are awaiting a confirmation of the replacement of the damaged windows alongside the new disability access door, this will complete all outstanding works.

Members are encouraged to point out any defects to me or any Board member so they can be addressed promptly, especially if they are safety concerns.

#### Shade

We have additional shade systems available and in storage that are yet to be installed, shortly you will see one installed over the bench between the Norm Foenander and Keith Lassig Greens, if this is effective, we will install shades along all four of those benches.

#### Technology

Members are reminded that our Wi-Fi system which is open to all members and guests to use, we have no cap on usage so feel free to connect and use the Wi-Fi.

An additional CCTV camera has been installed to monitor the BBQ area and storage shed. We have several break-ins into the storage shed so a stronger door will be installed, thank you to Mark Murphy for his help in resolving this security issue.

A new Point of Sale / EFTPOS system has been installed into the bar, this new system enables significantly better tracking and reporting of sales and will help us both stock the bar and work out how many staff we need at any time. Please be patient as our bar volunteers get up to speed with operating the new system.

#### **Capital Works**

Looking forward to 2022~23 we are planning on updates to the toilet facilities, subject to approval from the Council and funding being available.

During 2021 we had flooding under the floor of the hall, caused by blocked and broken stormwater drains. These drains have been repaired and several stumps replaced under the hall floor. We have other drainage issues under the concrete apron along the North side. Potentially this concrete may need to be removed, pipes replaced, and concrete replaced. We will wait until after this bowls season for this work.

Thank you to the Board for their support and allowing me to spend our hard-earned savings to provide a facility that is the envy of many clubs and will be enjoyed by our members for years to come.



### FINANCIAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT

#### **Financial Director**

The financial report of Moorabbin Bowling Club Inc has been prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act 2001, and in line with our principles of good governance has been independently reviewed by Mark Robb (CPA) of Willmott Rob. The financial statements have been certified as giving a true and fair view of the Club's financial position and of its performance for the year ended June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2022.

Thank you to Grace for managing the bowl's account, Anita for uniform sales and Pauline and Ange for their sterling work in balancing the bar sales and to everyone who contributed to our fund-raising activities which are not only essential to club finances but also club culture.

#### Treasurer's Report

#### Introduction

Financially the past 2 years have been 'extraordinary'. Firstly, due to the impact of Covid, where reduced trading in key areas was fortunately more than offset by Government subsidies, and secondly in 2021 when we received \$108k from the sale of Southern Indoor Bowls.

Over this period our core business, subscriptions, green fees, and barefoot bowls has remained consistent. This year all bowls related activity generated 26% of income, Bar - 25%, Sponsorship - 7%, Clubhouse Hire -3% and Donations/Grants a substantial 38%.

The Club received sizeable contributions from the Department of Jobs, Precincts and Regions, designed to promote Victoria's economic recovery, however we won't have the luxury of this form of Government support going forward.

#### Summary

On the expense side greenkeeper charges were higher due to the creation of the Jan Shaw Green. Clubhouse costs were driven by purchases such as the credenza and lounge, sanitary bins/change table, and new cutlery plus an increase in cleaning and chemical charges. Utility costs were in line with 2021. Council did charge rent in 2022 which it had waived the previous year. Greens treatment includes chemicals for both greens. Wages and salaries doubled as we used more paid bar staff.

Overall, a net profit of \$72K was generated but without the Government monies it would have been a (\$20k) loss, so we need to be mindful of this.

In the balance sheet it should be noted we have cash at bank of \$80k plus a Bendigo Bank investment account of \$100k. Under non-current assets are all the expenses and equipment purchases related to the establishment of the Jan Shaw Green, totaling just over \$191K. 'Highlights' of this expenditure include the decking, scoreboards, shade sails, retractable blinds, aluminum bench seating, decking furniture, greens mower, BBQ, sound, and lighting systems, plus our contribution to council. (All of these capital items will now be added to the asset register).

Cash at year end has reduced significantly due to the above acquisitions from \$307k in 2021 to \$184k this year.

#### Conclusion

Most of our big-ticket items have now been purchased and we have a wonderful resource for all members and guests to enjoy.

Our challenge in the coming year will be to continue to maximize our revenue opportunities whilst controlling our expenditure in the light of increasing costs for most services, products, and equipment.
