The toilets upgrade has been flagged with the Council and they have indicated they will consider this for their next budget, nothing is a yet approved. We would be requesting a shower and change facilities into both toilet areas.

We will be having our usual pre-season working bee with lots of gardening, clean-up, and other preparation for our bowls season. Many hands make light work please make every effort to come down and spend an hour or two.

These unavailable players in all side had major impact on the downstream selection of our Saturday 4, 5 & 6.

I believe our success was attributed to **Communication** between the selection committee and all skips & advisers (Side 4,5 & 6) this was paramount so we could archive success if by chance we made the finals. Meetings occurred both by phone and group meetings before and after Christmas with side advisers and skips, we all agreed on stable sides for the last 4 weeks of the home & away in January to allow consistency and teams to build comradery.

FINANCIAL DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Introduction

The following financial statements have been prepared to give a true and fair view of Moorabbin Bowling Club Inc's financial position as at June 30, 2023, and to reflect its performance for the year ended on that date.

An independent review has been completed by Mark Robb of Wilmott Robb to confirm we have met the requirements of the Corporations Act 2001.

Also included is an updated asset register. Whilst the values are generally accurate, its main point is to provide a record for insurance purposes.

Overview

We are currently in the process of changing our banking arrangements from ANZ to Bendigo Bank – Community Bank Highett. Some of you may have noticed this when you paid your 2023/24 membership fees. Last financial year we received \$2750 from Bendigo Bank as part of a Gold Sponsorship and Signage package.

On June 30 cash on hand was \$207K, comprising term deposit (Bendigo Bank) of \$101K and general trading account (ANZ) of \$104K, plus Bar account of \$2K.

Summary

This past year has been one of restraint as it was important to identify what the post-Covid landscape looked like. Following two years of 'unrestricted' spending to build and outfit the Jan Shaw Green, a significant halt was placed on over and above expenditure so we could gain a true indication of our fundamental operating costs.

Total costs for this financial year were \$186K (\$15, 500 per month) or \$1430 per member per year to cover the basics necessary for the everyday running of the Club. Given our annual fee for full membership is \$240, this represents a substantial gap which must be covered by other revenue sources.

The only special expenditure was the purchase of the new Moorabbin Thunder uniforms and the allocation of a shirt to all full members.

Without the luxury of government assistance (Covid benefits) total income year on year was down \$42K. Fortunately, our major revenue sources all outperformed the previous year's result. Hire of the Clubhouse was particularly strong, up by \$16K, driven by functions and boosted by the Red Cross Lifeblood usage. (On a positive note, Lifeblood have just confirmed new dates for the next 12 months).

Bar sales increased by 12%, reflecting the improved hall hire and barefoot bowls numbers.

Sponsorship topped the \$20K mark and we are indebted to our major sponsors for their continuing support during challenging economic times.

Overall, we were able to record a modest profit of \$20K.

Conclusion

Over the next 12 months we will need to continue to carefully monitor our expenditure and endeavour to maximise revenue opportunities. We have already increased our hall hire charge.

Our next major project requiring significant funding will most likely be the replacement of the synthetic green. Whilst the Board is committed to ensuring we have the best possible facilities for all members to enjoy at present this is outside our financial scope.
